Agriculture is the economic engine of Arkansas and the Mississippi Delta, where 4 million acres of farmland produce an abundance of rice, corn, wheat, soybeans, and cotton.

There's a way to grow these crops that's better for farmers. Regenerative agriculture builds healthy soil with little or no inputs. When farmers build healthy soil, they produce more and better crops. For farmers, this way of working the land means fewer expenses – and more profits.

Regenerative agriculture methods include no till, cover crops, prairie strips, and diverse crop rotation. The result: Richer soil, healthier food, better yields. Regenerative agriculture also conserves and cleans water supplies, increases plant and animal diversity, and protects pollinators.

Fifteen percent of the world's agricultural lands are farmed regeneratively today. Farmers across the U.S., including pioneers right here in Arkansas, are growing their crops *with* nature – and reviving agricultural prosperity in the process.

We're bringing this revival to Arkansas and the Mississippi Delta.

We've established Delta Conservation as a new nonprofit organization in Arkansas and acquired a 1,000-acre farm in Poinsett and Cross counties. The farm will serve as a demonstration site for regenerative farming practices, a test bed for new methods, and a regional center for farmer training and scientific research. Rodale Institute, the global leader in regenerative organic agriculture, will be our partner in supporting Delta farmers to thrive.

We are building this organization because the Delta is home.

Our families farmed in the Delta for generations and we grew up working those farms. Farmers with healthy land are more self-reliant and more prosperous. Our communities benefit in turn.

Delta Conservation is raising funds so we can work the farm – and realize our long-term vision of establishing campuses across Arkansas, Mississippi and Louisiana to create a more flourishing future for the place we call home.
